Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

LO 1,2 are developed & achieved through a series of research informed asynchronous online lectures that cover key topics.

The knowledge and theory introduced in these asynchronous lectures will be further explored in four synchronous workshop days delivered on campus or online (subject to circumstances), which will provide students with opportunity to discuss, analyse and apply topics and to improve their understanding of the material covered in the module (LO 1-6). These workshop days are supported with synchronous online seminars and student-centred independent learning,

Extensive use is made of the Virtual Learning Environment & this medium is used to complement asynchronous online lectures and the synchronous online seminars, as well as to support students.

Time is allocated within the module for students to engage with interactive learning objects (including relevant websites, documents & a range of online resources such as video clips & blogs etc.) designed and packaged to support specific learning objectives (LO 1-6). This is underpinned by independent study time.

All LO are assessed via a 30 Presentation. Students will be able to submit presentation plan prior to the final submission date & receive formative feedback.
